

Incident Commander
Unified Command

Position Responsibilities


- **Operations Branch Leader**
- Logistics Branch Leader
- Planning Branch Leader
- Finance/Administrative Branch Leader

Position Assignment

- Incident Commander is first person on scene
- IC may be reassigned when a more qualified person arrives
- Duties are assigned based on ability and experience, <u>NOT</u> seniority
- Depending on the incident, different people would be most qualified for the same assignment

Position Assignment

- Position Assignment
- Size of incident
- Resources
- **Emphasize** workers
- Span of Control
 - 1 supervisor for 3 to 7 workers
 - Each position reports to only one supervisor
