Workers' Compensation is designed to provide medical care, wage replacement, and other benefits for work-related injuries and illnesses.

INCIDENT GUIDELINES

Initial management of all Workers' Compensation Incidents (On-the-job injuries, Blood/Body Fluid Exposures) including counseling, assessment of risk and treatment will be initiated at the training site where the incident occurred.

- Report to Employee/Occupational Health Services during office hours (call appropriate number below to confirm office hours) or the Emergency Department after hours for initial care.
- You must **immediately** report all injuries and illness which you believe may be work-related to your Program Director, Coordinator and Dyan Ruelas, HR Analyst.
